# You've Changed Lives

2019 has been fruitful in our vision to end poverty and hunger! I am so thankful for the impact you're making in the lives of the poor people we serve. So many of these children, small holder farmers and women wouldn't have had a chance to grow their farms and take care of their children. This is our second year doing the same but growing stronger.

Through your support, we have been able to reach out to over 300 young ones with various support, delivered seedlings to more farmers and training youth and women in savings scheme. We have also connected over 8 group to financial services and 100 acquired solar home systems through sensitization and linkage to solar businesses.

You've also changed families. Our team of volunteers have provided tremendous support to our beneficiaries and hope for more next year.

As we look forward to 2021, we know you'll be excited about the future. We plan to do more with our emphasis centering on the holistic development of children. Our work for supporting small holder farmers to increase their productivity will continue.

## Empowering women farmers through groups

This year, we formed 8 self help groups which have been empowered to do savings and credit. These groups have increased on their income and production on farm. Ssenkima Michael, one of the beneficiary farmers achieve 100% increase in production this year and took up a 100,000/= loan from the group.

About 100 beneficiaries benefited from their group credit facilities. This has seen increase in group savings.

This year saw an increase in the number of youth businesses supported. There is a big improvement in the businesses we support in terms of profit and savings. 10 youth businesses are now running formally with books of accounts and can borrow from a financial institution. The number in need is overwhelming and due to resource constraints, we were not able to serve all. We continue to work with PLHAs and CLHAs to boost their income and immunity and ensuring they are health.

## Our commitment to work with communities

First, we **identify the needs** in a community through community engagements and focus groups. Our aim is to remain locally grounded in communities where our beneficiaries stay.

Next, we **look for the best innovative solution** to eliminate the problems identified. We work with communities, religious institutions, focus groups and community engagements to design solutions.

Then, we **EMPOWER** our beneficiaries. Our solutions are aimed at **empowering beneficiaries to be self-reliant, resilient and able**. When we do these three steps, peoples' lives are changed. When all are empowered, little will be needed to change the whole community.


